# Legislation & regulations touch all aspects of our company

At Capital One, we believe that engaging in the legislative and regulatory rulemaking processes are important for our customers, business, and associates. Our advocacy often involves collaboration and thought leadership in the public and private sectors as well as advocating through lobbying and coalitions.

Capital One's public policy agenda in the U.S. is managed on a day-to-day basis by the Government and Policy Affairs Group (GPAG), part of Capital One's External Affairs organization.

Given the highly regulated nature of our business, we focus the majority of our time and attention on banking policy. Legislation often takes years of planning, dialogue, and cultivation to develop, and when enacted, it touches all aspects of our company. From policies governing the payments landscape to the corporate tax code, Capital One is impacted by the legislation enacted by lawmakers in Washington, D.C. and state capitals, and local jurisdictions and regulations issued at the state, federal, and local levels.

We engage on a variety of public policy issues affecting the financial services industry. These issues include, among others, the payments systems, consumer protection, macro-prudential regulation, privacy, tax, technology, employment, cybersecurity, and community development lending. We embrace the role that legislation and regulation plays in ensuring the safety and soundness of our industry and protecting the vital interest of our customers—be they individual consumers, small businesses or large corporations.





Beyond policies that impact our economy and financial system, Capital One is also focused on efforts that affect our associates and customers. We actively lend our voice to national and local efforts to advance affordable housing goals, create opportunities in our workforce and society. Through speaker series, policy communications and bipartisan event engagements, we provide associates of all political backgrounds with the tools and information to engage on the issues that matter most to them.

Capital One also engages in political expenditures through a voluntary associate-funded Political Action Committee (PAC), as well as certain corporate expenditures, as further detailed in this report. Capital One has been consistently recognized for our commitment to transparent political disclosure and effective governance and accountability.



## 2024 Federal & State Lobbying Activities

At Capital One we continuously seek to engage in the policymaking process in a thoughtful manner while staying true to our central tenets of doing the best for our customers, associates, communities and the overall company.

Capital One’s federal lobbying reports for 2024 are publicly available and on file with the Secretary of the US Senate and the Clerk of the US House of Representatives.

Capital One also engages in lobbying at the state and local level. Capital One fulfills all legal and regulatory requirements, which vary by locality, as part of the company’s compliance with lobbying and ethics disclosures.

# 2024 Portion of Dues Attributable to Lobbying Expenses

Capital One belongs to and pays regular dues to trade associations as defined under Section 501(c)(6) of the IRS code and social welfare organizations as defined under Section 501(c)(4) of the IRS code that engage in federal lobbying. Our membership with

trade groups and related organizations gives us the opportunity to discuss our policy interests and serve the needs of our broader stakeholder communities. While we may not agree with every position of each organization, we believe in the diversity of thought and driving sound policy outcomes.

The company voluntarily discloses its trade and social welfare group affiliations in which we contribute \$5,000 or more (rounded to the nearest \$5,000) in amounts attributed to lobbying as identified by those organizations as non-deductible expenditures under § 162(e)(1) of the IRS code which are detailed as follow:

# Political Expenditures & Advocacy Governance Policies

## **BOARD OF DIRECTORS OVERSIGHT**

The company's Board of Directors plays an important role in overseeing Capital One's public policy engagement and political participation. The Governance and Nominating Committee (GNC) of the Board, which is composed entirely of independent directors, oversees the Corporation's governance policies regarding political activity and expenditures. The GNC annually reviews our public policy agenda and advocacy programs. The committee approves on an annual basis its contribution criteria, spending guidelines and total corporate expenditure budget. This committee also reviews on an annual basis the Corporation's political contributions, including contributions to candidates, political action committees, corporate contributions, PAC to PAC contributions (e.g., trade associations PACs) and the Corporation's Government and Policy Affairs Group Annual Report.



## **2024 STATEMENTS ON INDEPENDENT POLITICAL EXPENDITURES & BALLOT MEASURES**

Capital One did not use any PAC or corporate funds to make any direct independent expenditures on behalf of candidates running for office in 2024, nor did Capital One use any PAC or corporate funds in support of or opposition to any ballot measures.

## **CRITERIA FOR POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS**

Capital One's political contributions during the reporting period were all made in accordance with its Corporate and PAC Political Contributions Guidelines. Contributions for federal offices and some state and local offices are made through the Capital One Financial Corporation Associates Political Fund. Additionally, Capital One makes corporate contributions in states where permissible under law. These contributions are directed to



statewide offices, state legislatures and local offices. Capital One does not contribute to presidential or judicial candidates. All such contributions made by Capital One are publicly disclosed.

We support candidates, on a bipartisan basis, who responsibly evaluate issues of concern to our company, associates and customers. We generally focus on members of leadership, members of relevant committees and members from states or districts where Capital One has facilities. We also seek to support candidates that focus on broader issues of importance to our communities and associates.

As a part of Capital One's engagement strategy to maximize its voice, we also make contributions to certain trade association PACs to which Capital One belongs. In addition, contributions are made to leadership PACs of particular members of Congress and general purpose committees supporting coalitions of candidates.

### **APPROVAL AND REPORTING OF POLITICAL CONTRIBUTIONS**

Requests for political contributions are evaluated by the Contributions Committee and approved by the Managing Vice President, Head of Government and Policy Affairs. Political spending reflects the company's interests and not those of individual associates. The mid-year report outlines contributions made January 1 - June 30 of the calendar year. The Government and Policy Affairs Group Annual Report is a compilation of all contributions for the year, as well

as lobbying activities, and as noted is approved by the Board of Directors GNC. The political contributions are based on the calendar year in which they are approved, which may differ from when recipients report receiving the contribution. The reports can be found on the Investor Relations section of our corporate website.
